

Harry Potter Club


Tuesday, Dec. 17 ~ 5:15-6 pm Ages 8 and up


The Paris Library by Janet Skeslien Charles

This historical fiction novel tells the story of a Parisian librarian who becomes involved in a very dangerous resistance movement once WWII begins. Interwoven with her story is that of a teenager living in 1980s Montana who is curious to learn more about her neighbor's mysterious past. As these two narratives intertwine, the book delves into themes of friendship, sacrifice, and the incredible power of literature.

Teenager Avery Grambs finds out that she has unexpectedly inherited a fortune from a mysterious billionaire named Tobias Hawthorne, and she is forced to compete with the Hawthorne family who believe that the inheritance should be theirs.
